unta Gorda is the site of a truly unique natural ecosystem. It is situated at the point where the Peace River intersects
Charlotte Harbor, the second largest estuary in Florida. Seven natural tributaries and some of the area's best nature parks and preserves are easily accessible and offer a rich natural tapestry. Families will be amazed at the wildlife sightings at every turn. Alligators, dolphins, manatees and sea turtles all cohabitate in this remarkable landscape of salt marshes and mangroves. KAYAK IN SHELL CREEK

While Charlotte Harbor is a kayaker's favorite, there's one place five miles from Punta Gorda that locals can't get enough of: Shell Creek. This straightforward, easily accessed stream is carved out between hills of cypress and oak trees, so it's perfect on a windy day. Audrey Lima, co-owner of It's Time! GET CLOSE TO WILDLIFE AT BABCOCK RANCH

At Babcock Ranch get a glimpse of 70,000 acres of freshwater marshes, prairies and flatlands, and a swamp. The ranch's 90-minute eco-tours take guests through these adventurous landscapes by bus. TEST YOUR BALANCE AT STAND UP PADDLEBOARDING

Stand up paddleboarding has become a popular water sport over the last few years, but it's more than just a great workout. Around Punta Gorda, stand up paddleboarders have the rare opportunity to glide off-thebeaten path waterways and see wildlife up close. Hooked on SUP, offering stand up paddleboarding eco-tours through the region, suggests first time visitors take a tour through Don Pedro State Park to wade through mangrove tunnels, secret lagoons and unspoiled beaches.
